I would like to start this week's message with an invitation to come out to the ribbon cutting for the new play structure at Raoul Wallenberg Park which will be happening this Saturday at 10:00 a.m. We will have treats for the kids. This is one of two parks in the Ward in which the City are replacing the play structure. The other being Bateman Park. We will also be putting in a splash pad at Ben Franklin Park that will be fully operational by next year. The City has started the design process for the refurbishment of Steve MacLean Park. This project will likely be finished next year.

I would like to thank all of you that came out to the open house Wednesday night to discuss the Wallford Way, Farlane Boulevard, Hilliard Avenue, Millbrook Crescent, Deer Park Road and Fisher Avenue road, sewer and watermain replacement project. 

Traffic Impacts in Ottawa for the Coming Days Beginning Friday May 25

May 24, 2018 – Upcoming projects will have the following impacts on Ottawa traffic:

Tamarack Ottawa Race Weekend – There will be numerous rolling road closures from all the races taking place on Saturday, May 26 and Sunday, May 27 as part of the Tamarack Ottawa Race Weekend. Find information on all planned road closures and maps on the Tamarack Ottawa Race Weekend website.

Great Glebe Garage Sale – Saturday, May 26, from 8 am to 3 pm, also marks another edition of the Great Glebe Garage Sale that will bring additional traffic and limit available parking in the area.

Rideau Canal Crossing – The southbound lane on Queen Elizabeth Drive between Second Avenue and Fifth Avenue will be closed to vehicles beginning Friday May 25 between 9 am and 3 pm each day for a period of one week, weather permitting. The closure is required for work on the Rideau Canal Crossing between Fifth Avenue and Clegg Street.

Carling Avenue – Carling Avenue will have intermittent lane closures between Bayshore Drive and Richmond Road from Monday, May 28 until Friday, July 20. The work will take place outside of peak periods and is required to allow for the resurfacing of the roadway and other related work.

Old Tenth Line Road – The northbound lane on Old Tenth Line Road between St. Joseph Boulevard and Tenth Line Road will be closed to traffic beginning Monday, May 28 between 7 am and 10 pm each day for a period of two weeks. The closure is required to allow for the resurfacing of the roadway and other related work.

Signed detours will be in place to direct motorists around the closures. For more updates on the construction and road work activity across the city, or for information about traffic and travel planning, visit the City's Traffic Report on ottawa.ca or follow the City's traffic account on Twitter.

Call for recipients

To commemorate the service and sacrifices made by Canadian veterans at home and during international conflicts, the Nepean Museum is issuing plaques to Celebrate Canada's Best. To be eligible, recipients must meet the following criteria:

Must have served with the Canadian Armed Forces, OR have served with a Canadian police force that has served overseas carrying out either military or relief services;

Currently reside in the boundaries of the former municipality of Nepean as they existed between 1978 and 2000 OR have resided for a substantial part of one's life within those boundaries:

Did not receive a dishonourable discharge upon exiting the force. Celebrating Canada's Best plaques will be issued in the fall of 2018.
